

PSLifestyle: Co-creating a Positive and Sustainable Lifestyle tool with and for European Citizens

28 February 2022. A newly-launched Horizon 2020 project is **closing the gap between climate awareness and individual action**. **PSLifestyle** aims to deeply engage with and mobilise individuals in eight European countries to adopt positive, sustainable, and healthier lifestyles by helping them reduce their environmental impact. PSLifestyle's **online tool** will help individuals get informed about the environmental impact of their day-to-day lives as well as inspire them to think about their current habits and how they could be changed through smart everyday actions.

Through **PSLifestyle Living Labs**, individuals will engage with other locals in their neighborhood and city to jointly develop and shape visions of a good life with the environment in mind. By joining the Living Labs, individuals will then help design solutions to make those visions a reality. The Living Labs will take place in **eight European countries**: Tallinn (Estonia), Tampere (Finland), Wuppertal (Germany), Athens (Greece), Milan, Parma and the Tuscany Region (Italy), Lisbon and Porto (Portugal), Ljubljana (Slovenia), and Izmir (Turkey). Within these Living Labs, individuals will contribute to further improving the PSLifestyle online tool, including the tool's functions and even how it could look like. By participating, individuals will become part of the European Ambassadors for Positive and Sustainable Lifestyles.
